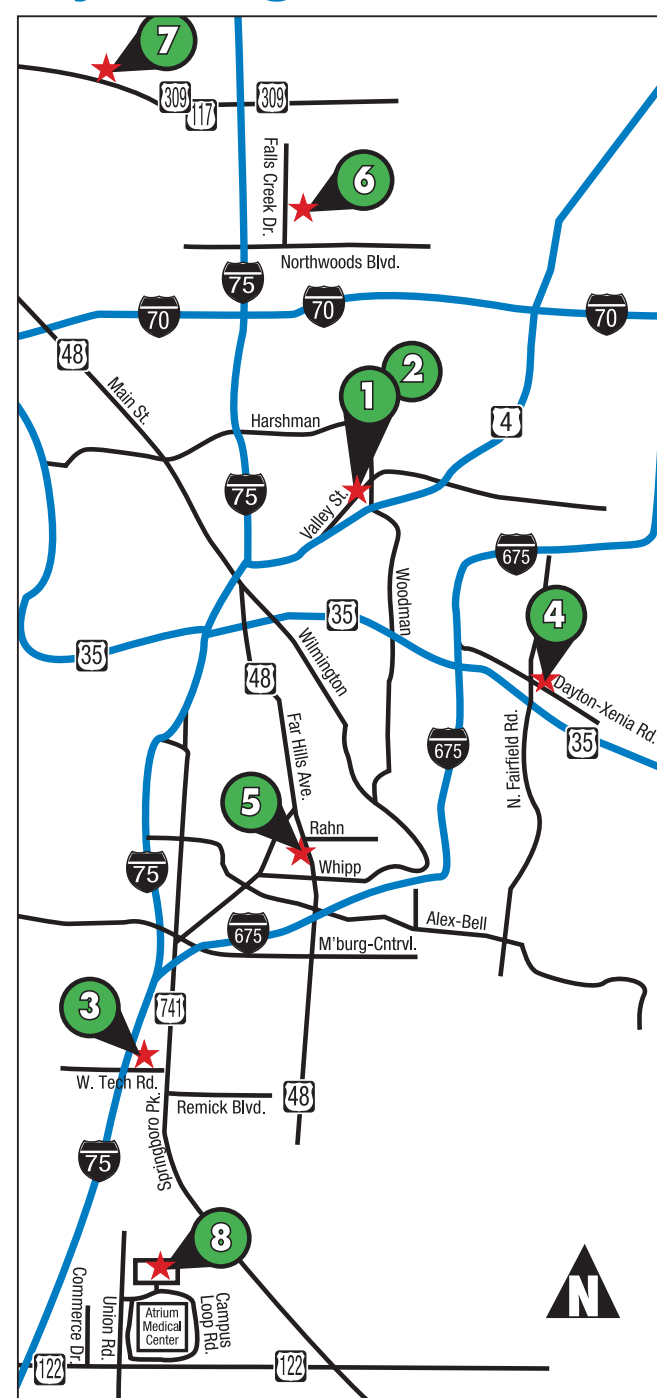

Dayton Children's Outpatient Care Center – Springboro

This new facility south of Dayton will be open in early November at 3333 West Tech Road, just off Route 741.

Dayton Children's third testing center will host a community open house December 13 and open to the public December 15. This new facility will offer a range of testing services such as basic x-ray, ultrasound, echocardiograms, EKGs and full laboratory services.

Dayton Children's Outpatient Testing Centers are the only testing centers in the region devoted to children, offering medical imaging, EKG and laboratory services for infants, children and teens.

WE'RE "GOING GREEN"

The Dayton Children's Outpatient Care Center – Springboro has been designed to meet all requirements for Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design (LEED) and certification by the U. S. Green Building Council.

Here's what we've done:

- Installing a "cool roof" – a light-colored roof to reduce the amount of energy needed for heating and cooling.
- Reduced lawn and plant watering by 50 percent.
- Our heating and air conditioning systems use less energy.
- Our lights turn off when they're not needed.
- We used new materials made with recycled content.
- We have a recycling program.
- Our building is smoke-free and we get more fresh air from the outside.

Last spring, Suddenjoi Harris felt pain in her ears. For the 3-year-old's mother Tracey Lawson, finding time to get to the doctor was difficult because of the family's schedule, but she knew where her daughter could get great care –

"I took her there and the ear infection was effectively treated," says Tracey.

"Suddenjoi has tubes in her ear, and finding a doctor who is comfortable working with the tubes can be tough. But the doctor at Dayton Children's knew what she was doing and really helped my daughter."

With three children, Tracey usually makes a trip to the Dayton Children's Urgent Care every one to two months.

"With three kids, there is always something going on," she says.

The treatment her children receive when they go to Dayton Children's Urgent Care is one reason Tracey keeps bringing them back.

"Sometimes, I think other urgent cares just put a Band-Aid on the problem but don't really treat it. Then you have to go to the doctor again," says Tracey.

"At Dayton Children's, my children's problems are treated right the first time."

Rehab, audiology services at new Springboro location

All rehabilitative services in our community locations are provided by the same staff caring for infants, children and teens on Dayton Children's main campus.

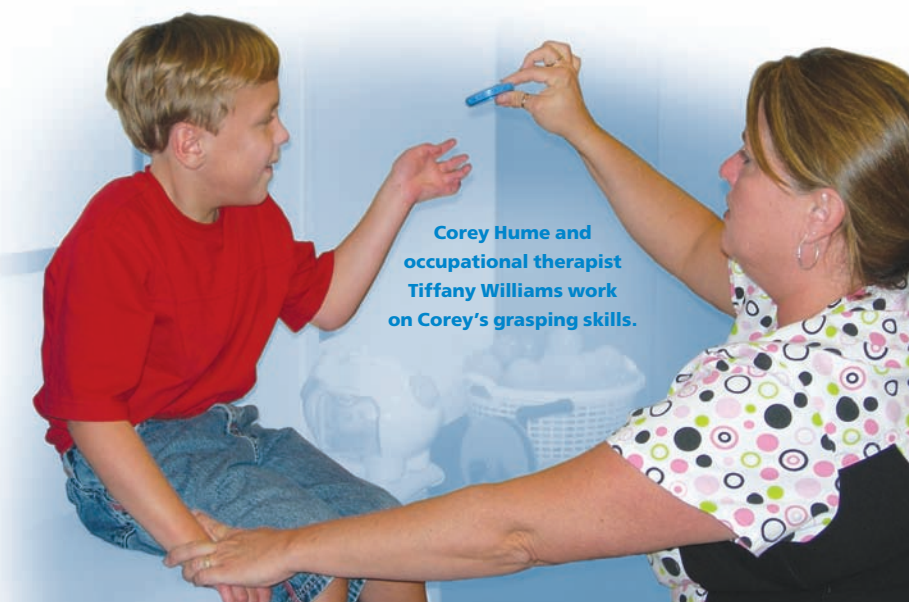
All therapists (physical, occupational and speech) and audiologists are licensed and certified and specialize in caring for children. Children who need a variety of services benefit from a team approach to ensure all their needs are met.

At the new Dayton Children's Outpatient Care Center – Springboro, a fully equipped gym and private therapy rooms will be available for occupational, physical and speech therapy. Audiology services include

hearing tests, infant hearing screenings, hearing aid fitting, etc.

Special programs such as evaluation and treatment for autism,

Sounds of Reading (for phonological problems affecting reading skills) and general articulation and language therapies are also offered.

"Kid-sized" medical radiation doses

Nathan Ormsby of Beavercreek has undergone more imaging tests than many children his age. The 5-year-old is a regular in the medical imaging department at Dayton Children's since being diagnosed with stage IV neuroblastoma, cancer of the sympathetic nervous system, in August 2006.

"Nathan has had CT scans, x-rays, MRI, bone scans, nuclear medicine tests. I think he's had every imaging procedure you have here," Nathan's mother Rachel says. For that reason, she is grateful that Dayton Children's takes care to minimize radiation doses.

The pediatric radiologists at Dayton Children's and at the Outpatient Care Center – Springboro individualize each CT examination to account for a child's weight and size, ensuring that the child receives the minimum radiation needed to complete the procedure.

"Children are typically smaller than adults and require less radiation to penetrate the body," says Elizabeth Ey, MD, medical director of medical imaging at Dayton Children's.

"Radiation safety has always been a priority for us. We continue to improve our ways to diagnose childhood illness in a safe and caring environment."

Location changes help meet region's needs

Dayton Children's is making changes to our locations to better meet the needs of the region's children and families. Beginning November 7, Dayton Children's will be moving urgent care services to our new Outpatient Care Center – Springboro.

If you currently use Children's Urgent Care at Lamplighter Square, Kettering

The last day of business for urgent care at Lamplighter Square (5334 Far Hills Avenue) will be November 4. Urgent care services will open at the new Outpatient Care Center – Springboro on November 7

at 3:00 pm. Urgent care at the main Dayton Children's campus will continue.

If you currently use the laboratory or medical imaging at Lamplighter Square, Kettering

Laboratory and medical imaging facilities will remain open at Lamplighter Square, 5334 Far Hills Avenue. The facility will be known as Dayton Children's Outpatient Testing Center – Kettering.

If you currently use rehabilitative services at Lamplighter Square, Kettering

Rehabilitative services at 5334 Far Hills

Avenue at Lamplighter Square will be closing November 6 and reopening November 10 at the new Dayton Children's Outpatient Care Center – Springboro.

If you currently use Dayton Children's Outpatient Testing Center – Springboro

The Outpatient Testing Center located at 60 Remick Boulevard, will be closing on November 6 and moving down the road to the new Outpatient Care Center – Springboro. All laboratory and medical imaging services will reopen at the new center November 7 at 8:30 am.
